

Engaging children aged 7 to 12

Notes from the 'Children meet music' working community meeting 10th March 2014

How can we more meaningfully engage children aged 7 to 12 in school and family settings?

Advice from the group:

- Choose short pieces
- Commission appropriate pieces
- Create programmes that move between rooms/spaces e.g. in a museum/gallery
- Play pieces more than once
- Create opportunities for audience feedback
- Invite children to lie down and close their eyes
- Include storytelling, drawing and writing, moving and dancing
- Create education packs including documents and CDs
- Take school students out of school

Dagna Sadkowska from the Polish ensemble, Kwartludium, has written an inspiring interactive guide entitled 'Contemporary Music: Creative Encounters' full of practical ways of engaging children with new music.
